About Grayson County:

The county seat is Sherman, Texas, located about 60 miles north of Dallas on I-75. Sherman's population is approximately 47,500 people and the neighboring city of Denison has approximately 26,000 people. The county population is over 146,000, including about 12 cities and growing rapidly. Grayson County borders the northern edge of Collin County, which is one of the fastest growing counties in the State of Texas.

There are 14 Assistant District Attorneys and 19 support staff. The District Attorney's Office handles civil cases, all misdemeanor and felony cases, child protective services cases, juvenile cases, etc. There are two County Courts at Law and three Judicial District Courts, each having general jurisdiction.
